

Heat Stress in Chickens

Birds are subject to heat stress when heat and humidity reach high levels they are not accustomed to. Heat stress in poultry can result in increased water intake, excessive panting, and eventually death.

Keeping Birds Cool

Provide Ventilation

Adequate airflow at the bird's level is key to eliminating heat. Increasing ventilation when possible should be your first priority.

Managing Water

Birds will drastically increase their water intake when experiencing high heat. Sufficient, cool, and fresh water supply will keep the birds hydrated.

Feeding

Birds are often hungriest in the morning, and will usually fill up when fed then. This makes them more prone to heat stress in the afternoon when temperatures are at a peak. Withdrawing feed 6 hours before peak temperatures can reduce the risk of heat stress.

Using Electrolytes

Heat stress causes increased loss of several minerals including potassium, sodium, phosphorus, magnesium and zinc. Adding electrolytes to their water will continue to keep them hydrated despite the mineral loss.


Supplementing Vitamins

Supplementing drinking water with vitamins A, D, E and B complex can be effective at tackling heat stress mortality in broilers. In breeding poultry, vitamin C can effectively moderate warm temperature declines in egg production and eggshell quality in laying hens, and sperm production in breeder males.
